ANNEX 1 (reference): list of materials provided for the Upper Advanced Program:

- For creating Mokuhanga works:
 - Japanese paper (Panshion K155 or Kochi roll white/natural);
 - Woodblocks (shina plywood, 30x 22.5 cm, 6 mm thickness);
 - Watercolor paints and nori.
 - *Please note you will use small works (up to the above mentioned block size) for making a scroll and a hanging scroll. If you want to use any works you created before, please take this into consideration.
 - ** Please bring your tools with you. If you don't have any of them, you can use the tools (knives, chisels, brushes and *barens*) provided at the studio.
- For making a scroll and a hanging scroll (or a folding screen):
 - Cloth, decorative Japanese paper, Japanese paper for mounting, special glue, sticks, strings and other necessary accessories, (honeycomb board for a folding screen);
 - Cutter knife, scissors, brushes, spatula and other necessary tools.
